SAVE THE DATE! July 30-August 2, 2009 University of Missouri– St. Louis, South Campus

Plans for the second ARS Festival and Conference are in full swing. The Board has hired **Yvonne Miller-Nixon** as conference administrator. She is a member of the Baton Rouge (LA) chapter, and has impressive board, not-for-profit, and conference experience. She describes herself as "addicted to recorder playing...the instrument that touches [me] the most!" We are thrilled to have her dedication and expertise guiding this exciting process.

Committees have been working to finalize the faculty and conference schedule as well as prime-time performances. Other projects include writing grants, identifying fundraising ideas, and reaching out to music educators.

We are excited about the topics slated for the 2009 Festival and Conference—among them: sessions on all facets of recorder technique, composing and arranging, classroom teaching, improvisation, choosing a recorder and recorder maintenance, web site development, sessions for chapters, and opportunities to play in coached consorts. There will be panel discussions, master classes, concerts, and time to browse in the exhibit hall.

WEB SITE CHANGES AR MAILING

You may notice that your magazine and newsletter arrived this time without the customary flysheet (a white sheet with your mailing information). Since we can now provide more current contact information for members through the *Online Directory*, the need for a flysheet has disappeared. This also helps trim a little expense from the cost of producing and mailing *AR* and the *ARS Newsletter*—and is better for the environment.

Eliminating the flysheet also eliminates advance notice to people with memberships expiring in the near future—the pink flysheet showing that your renewal date was approaching in a month or so. Renewal date information is still printed on your mailing label. If it says 200809, that means your membership expires in September 2008.

You can always renew before a renewal notice is mailed from the office, using these methods: renew online; clip the membership form from a recent magazine and mail it with your check; or renew by telephone.

ENHANCEMENTS TO ARS WEB SITE

Online Directory

As money is available through your generous donations to the President's Appeal and Spring Fund Appeal, areas of the ARS web site are being expanded or enhanced. The *Online Directory*, now posted in the Members' Only area, can be searched by Last Name, City, State, Zip Code and Country. It works on all computer platforms!

Most ARS members opted to be in the *Online Directory*, but some people preferred not to be listed online. Membership data will be uploaded to the web site at least four times each year, insuring that contact information is reasonably up-to-date.

AR Magazine for years 1990-1999 posted

Another project funded by donations is scanning older AR issues and turning them into PDF files. These magazine issues were created in the days before electronic publishing. Currently all AR issues from 1990-2008 are available online in the Members' Only area.

Three Information Booklets available

For over a year, it has been a goal to provide some ARS publications online as a free service to members. During the summer, students scanned documents that only existed in hard copy, and mailed new copyright authorization requests to over 25 authors/contributors to the ARS Information Booklets and Consort Handbook. Three very popular booklets are now posted online:

More publications will be added as permission is received and some copyright issues resolved on music used in the publications.

SPRING FUND APPEAL

The ARS just finished another successful Spring Appeal, raising \$8,707 from 110 generous members. DUES SPECIAL EXTENDED TO NEW CHAPTERS

A proposal was made to the ARS Board, who agreed that doing it is a no-brainer!

New members who join the ARS during a chapter's first year of existence will now be eligible for a one-time membership dues rate of \$35.

APPLY NOW FOR CHAPTER GRANTS

November 15 is the deadline to apply for Chapter Grants for any projects starting January 1, 2009, or later. The Chapter Grant Program is intended to help chapters with 10 or members to initiate new projects or to expand existing projects by adding new features that the chapter may have difficulty financing on its own. It is meant to provide aid for one-time chapter projects or "seed money" for projects that the chapter might continue to finance by other means. Grants are not made for workshops. Preference is given for projects that:

- Show promise of increasing local and national membership
- Reach new audiences leading to greater diversity in ARS membership
- Provide special services (for example, to the elderly, to children, to beginners, to the visually-impaired, to the sick and disabled, to the economically-impaired, etc.)

Thanks to everyone who applied! Recorder players of any age and playing level are encouraged to apply for an ARS scholarship. Of this year's applicants, seven were young players (ages 15-21) and five were over 50 years of age.

Applications for weekend scholarships of less than \$125 are always accepted, but are best submitted at least two months before funding is needed.

Plan to announce events at least one month before they take place.

Digital photos of events should be at least 3"x4", and at least 300 dpi in a TIF or unedited JPEG format.
